Description 76 photographs mounted on cardboard. Primarily autopsy and clinical photographs from American Expeditionary Forces hospitals in Vichy, France. Also includes images of the hospitals and staff. Most have captions. Also includes autopsy reports. Some of the photographs possibly taken by the eight staff members of the Army Medical Museum who were dispatched to France (Vichy, Dijon, Paris and Chaumont) in Sept. 1918 to take over the role of collecting medical photographs from the Signal Corps.

The collection is arranged by photo number, subject (hospitals/staff, autopsy and clinical/wound) and name (alphabetical). This finding aid is exported from an Excel spreadsheet.

Explanation of categories and abbreviations: McCarrell

Photo #: This is the unique number assigned to the photograph by OHA. AEF stands for American Expeditionary Forces.

Original #: Number taken from information accompanying photograph.

Title: Taken from the information accompanying photograph. When photograph lacked such information, a description of the photograph appears in parentheses.

DOD: Date of Death taken from information accompanying photograph.

DOA: Date of Autopsy taken from information accompanying photograph.

Name, rank, Age, pathologist: Taken from information accompanying photograph and self explanatory.
